SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 118

## A RESOLUTION

To commend the Society of Consulting Psychology, the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology, Louisiana State University at Alexandria, the University of New Orleans, and Tulane University for their collective support and pro bono services during recovery efforts of hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

WHEREAS, the American Psychological Association has committed to hold its 114th Annual Convention in New Orleans in August 2006, to provide moral, spiritual, psychological, and economic support for Louisiana's recovery from hurricanes Katrina and Rita, and

WHEREAS, the Society for Consulting Psychologists and the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology, divisions of the American Psychological Association, are offering a special program called "Katrina Aid and Relief Effort" ; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this program is to provide business owners, managers, organizations, and employers pro bono consulting services in order to aid in economic recovery; and

WHEREAS, the Katrina Aid and Recovery Effort is co-sponsored by Louisiana State University at Alexandria, the A.B. Freeman School of Business at Tulane University, and the Department of Psychology at the University of New Orleans; and

WHEREAS, the collective support of the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology, the Society of Consulting Psychology, and public and private Louisiana universities enhance the recovery efforts of hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana acknowledges these humanitarian efforts provided by the collective efforts of these national psychology associations and Louisiana universities in order to promote human welfare by enhancing the economic well-being of small businesses, employers, organizations, and other economic entities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the presidents of the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology, the Society of Consulting Psychology, the chancellor of Louisiana State University at Alexandria, the chair of the Department of Psychology at the University of New Orleans, and the dean of the A.B. Freeman School of Business at Tulane University.
